Most Eucharistic miracles involve incidences in which the Host has "turned into human flesh and blood". Catholics believe that the consecrated Host is the real presence of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord, under the appearance of bread and wine. Therefore, Jesus through these miracles, merely manifests His Presence in a more tangible way. Our faith is not founded on Eucharistic miracles, but on the proclamation of the Lord Jesus, received with faith through the action of the Holy Spirit. Eucharistic miracles can encourage us to understand, appreciate and love the Eucharist. They can help us understand the astounding miracle, the real presence of Jesus becoming our spiritual food for our salvation, that occurs whenever the Eucharist is celebrated.

The exhibit contains 126 miracles approved by Bishops of the Catholic Church and are on 140 exhibit panels including 17 maps showing where the miracles occurred in 20 countries. Most of the churches at the sites of the miracles are Eucharistic sanctuaries or shrines honoring the miracle.
